Elisa-Jo, like a link between a little girl and her grandmother, with crossed destinies, in the joy and sadness of the moment, this Pierres Dorées white Beaujolais has a pretty lemon yellow color and a seductive nose with tones of fresh citrus fruits. Same tense aromatic palette on the palate combined with a lovely substance. The finish remains clean, well scented with citrus fruits, lemon peel and delicately spicy white flowers. A typical Beaujolais from the Pierres Dorées terroir.

Production :	3,000 bottles
Soil :	Hard limestone with iron oxide content, characterized by the presence of seashell fossils from the crinoid and gryphea family.
Varietal :	Chardonnay
Planting density :	5,000 vines/ha
Average age of vines :	12 years.
Yield :	55hl/hectare.
Location :	Denicé.
Exposure :	East and South-East.
Pruning :	Guyot, one fruiting cane, trellized
Cultivation :	Sustainable practices, HEV (High Environmental Value) certification .
Harvesting :	Manual harvesting with a sorting of the clusters on the estate. Gentle pressing of whole bunches
Vats :	91HI temperature-controlled stainless-steel vats.
Maceration :	8 – 10 days vinification at low temperature
Fermentation :	28 -30° C – controlled temperatures. The wine doesn't undergo malolactic fermentation in order to preserve the primary aromas from the Chardonnay.
Maturing :	4 months in stainless-steel vats
Bottling, Closure, BarCode :	On the estate, Cork, EAN : 3770004064250
Characteristics :	ABV 13%, Residual Sugar : 0,2g/L, Acidity : 3,30g/L
Cellar-ageing and serving :	Drink now. Serve at 13°C
Food and wine pairing :	Serve as an aperitif, with mixed salads, grilled fish, cheese soufflés, fondue leeks in lemon sauce, shrimp risotto, goat cheese and honey, lemon tartlet.

Terroir of Denicé « Les Pierres Dorées » (« Golden Stones »)

- Hard sedimentary limestone rock with « entroque » and fossilized sea-shells of crinoidea and Griphea (oyster fossils) laden with ferrous oxide giving this golden red colour to the stones of the vineyard.
- Chardonnay young vines trellized
- Gamay old vines
 - Gobelet
 - South-facing
 - Residual clay, chert (siliceous rock) and flint soil
- Beaujolais-Villages
- Beaujolais Pierres Dorées
